COMMUNITY OUTREACH



UPDATE ON THE ARCHDALE COMMUNITY CENTER

For many years, St. Andrew's UMC has welcomed its neighbors, e.g., AA, YMCA, neighborhood associations, etc. that were looking for a facility to serve our community. As this activity has increased through a collaboration of partners in recent years, the genesis of an idea was born. Our facility is a tremendous community asset that has been entrusted to us by God to serve our community. Is there a way to leverage our facility and our passion to serve this community to meet more of the needs of our neighbors? The leaders of St. Andrew's embarked on a journey around 18 months ago to determine if creating a separate, legal entity could offer an avenue to expand our outreach to the community.

I am happy to report that we have reached our first milestone in this journey. We have received notification that The Archdale Community Center has been recognized by the IRS as a separate non-profit organization established for charitable purposes. The hope is that this action will allow us to expand funding sources beyond religious and denominational support to further efforts such as Freedom School and other outreach into the Montclaire and surrounding neighborhoods.

There have been some misunderstandings about where we are in the process and what it may mean for our future. Let me offer a few insights that I hope will help allay some concerns:

- 1. This step to create a separate entity, The Archdale Community Center, was a necessary step in evaluating paths to expand our outreach. It does not cede any facility or portion of St. Andrew's to any other entity.
- 2. This step, or our development of a future plan, does not set us on a path to "rent" out portions of St. Andrew's to anyone that makes a reservation. Partners would need to comply with our facility use policies and seek to serve our community in a manner consistent with our standards.
- 3. Having The Archdale Community Center as a separate legal entity does open a path to seek and hopefully receive funds that will support our current and future outreach activities, but it is not a "money tree". We are hopeful that it will lessen the burden of our facility's operational and administrative oversight costs, however we can't and don't expect to pay our normal church costs through these funds.

In early 2020, we will have several forums for everyone to come and learn more about the possibilities this may have for ministries and programs at St. Andrew's. An initial committee will meet in the coming weeks to begin conversation about how The Archdale Community Center best fits with our ongoing ministries and activities and fulfills our role as a safe haven and beacon of light to a community in need. At the heart of this work is our call to welcome, engage, and develop a relationship with our neighbors so that we might "offer them Christ".

As we begin the next steps in this process, we look forward to sharing our progress and gaining your input. For now, we cherish your prayers as we begin, and we look forward to discussing more details in the coming months.


