

BEING PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY

With the church shooting in Charleston, the Administrative Council discussed our church's preparedness for emergency situations. We decided that we would like to pull together a broad group of church members to strengthen our church's plans and support in respond to all types of emergency situations. This group will compare our current policies and practices around emergency to the guidelines provided by FEMA and Church Mutual, our insurance company, to redevelop a strong response plan for multiple emergency situations. We will need people who are knowledgeable in emergency response, but we also need a diverse group of members who help lead in situations of ministry and worship while in our church building or in mission away from the building in order to develop robust plans for most situations.

We welcome all interested in this topic to help. We will need broad participation in order to be able to talk about all the types of situations that we have at St. Andrew's. Some examples of volunteers needed would be leaders for small groups for study or mission; or leader of children and youth events; or ushers; or church members who have a background in emergency response, police, fire, insurance or emergency preparedness from their work. We would like to collect interest in supporting this ad-hoc committee from now until January 16, 2016. This group will work on new policies and plans to provide a proposal back to the Administrative Council by Fall 2016. 
