In 1940, the General Conference of the Methodist Church established the Methodist Committee on Overseas Relief as a mission to work with displaced and destitute refugees of World War II. Over the last 75 years, the Methodist Church has evolved into the United Methodist Church and the Committee on Overseas Relief has evolved into the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which works to strengthen and transform the most vulnerable people and communities that have been ravaged by war, other conflicts, and by natural disasters. None of the UMCOR projects are funded by apportioned gifts, but are supported through second mile giving of the United Methodist members. UMCOR is able to allocate 100 percent of the money raised for each designated project because administrative costs are covered by the annual "One Great Hour of Sharing." BE A FREEDOM SCHOOL - D.E.A.R. READER (DROP EVERTHING AND READ)

As I sit here this icy morning drinking my cup of hot chocolate I am thinking about how lucky my children are to have a day off from school. They don't have to remember their multiplication facts, where energy comes from, European history or worry about homework tonight. They are outside riding their sled down the icy street with their friends without a care in the world (except who gets the next turn and how to get back up to the top). They will come inside in a little while to warm up and have a cup of hot chocolate too. They will tell me about all the fun they had and we will laugh with each other. My biggest worry is that they don't get hurt too bad and they stay bundled up.

This is not the case for all children who are out of school today.

Some families in our city, the neighbors not too far from us, will have a different day. They may be without power, even if Duke Energy has turned on the power for everyone else on their street. They may be hungry because there is no food in the pantry. They may not be able to tell funny stories of their adventures today because they had to stay inside while their parents went to work, they wouldn't get paid otherwise.

This is a year-round reality for many of the children that attend schools in our city.

As a mother, I don't have to worry about my children staying warm inside, how I'm going to feed them 3 meals a day, or how to make ends meet. Other mothers and fathers do, every day. I am able to focus on other things such as their education. For me, prioritizing things is simple compared to other parents'.

Thankfully, my church, St. Andrew's UMC, is part of a solution for these families. We help fund Freedom School. During the summer, children who are not reading on grade level are able to attend Freedom School. A warm breakfast and lunch, which is provided by the school, give children the nourishment needed to focus on their education. God's love is so apparent here making every child feel special and encouraged to learn to read. Wouldn't you like to be among those angels to help a child master and learn to read? Guess what, you can be one of those people, even if all the time you have is an hour lunch break you can be a DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) Reader. You can support this program finically as well through donations and attending fundraisers. .

Our first fundraiser for this wonderful program is going to be in March. We will have an authentic Mexican dinner prepared by some of the mothers' who children attend Freedom School. We will also have a talent show which is sure to be a treat.
