In addition, the one-on-one time spent with a student during DEAR (Drop Everything And Read) time gives the student more self-confidence. Teachers tell us that when students return to school in the fall, the ones who attended Freedom School are more ready to return and have more confidence in themselves. A student who attends three years of Freedom School is practically guaranteed to graduate from high school.
