GENERAL CONFERENCE

WRAP-UP. On Friday, May 3rd the 2024 edition of the 2020 General Conference wrapped up its work, worship and fellowship. Now comes the part of living into the decisions made. Over the course of two weeks, the delegates undertook much. There were, as I trust you have heard. changes made to The Book of Discipline and revisions to The Social Principles. A budget (much smaller) was approved for the work of the connectional church for the next quadrennium, bishop's retirements and allotments were approved. **Ordained deacons were** given sacramental authority

in their ministry context. A plan to regionalize and make our global church less U.S.

centric was approved. Historic moments included Bishop Tracy S. Malone, resident bishop of the East Ohio Conference, becoming the first **Black female president of the** Council of Bishops on April 30, 2024. And Bishop David Wilson, resident bishop of the Great Plains Conference, becoming the first Native American bishop to preside over the General Conference on April 25, 2024.

I am grateful that I got to attend and volunteer as did Pastor David and Sara. The event was an international gathering with elements of family reunion and camp meeting thrown in. I also recognize, that the most pressing question will be so how does this affect me and mine? "I am confident that this conference did nothing but provide St. Andrew's sure and sound footing to continue its ministry well into the future." The United **Methodist Church continues** to share common mission and values. The United Methodist Church remains anchored in scripture and commited to discipleship. We celebrate that our church transcends geography, borders, barriers and differences. And that The United Methodist Church is diverse and capable of serving ALL people. encourage you to continue to pray for the delegates as they make their way home, and for the work that was either furthered or started. 
